WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT ME.



We had hopes of having another child shortly after, but the season that followed was filled with grief, tears, trust, and a whole lot of crazy.

We were excited to purchase our first home and found what we believed to be the perfect house for our family. It didn't take long and all three of us were experiencing strange health symptoms after we moved in. To make a very long story short, we doctored for months without finding answers. Eventually, we figured out there was black, toxic mold in our home. After our house was tested, we were told to think of it as if it had burned down with all of our belongings inside of it. WHAT A DAY IN OUR LIFE LOOKS LIKE

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
